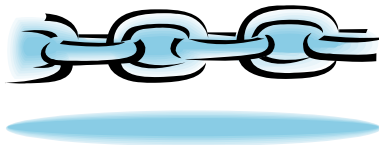




# GIRLS CARE...PROGRAM LINKS



## JUNIOR GIRL SCOUTS

**MY COMMUNITY Badge** -#3, #4, #7 or #8 - *Junior Girl Scout BadgeBook*, p. 53.

**SIGN OF THE RAINBOW** - Completing two items under the My Community Badge can be used as part of The Sign of the Rainbow-requirement #5 - *Junior Girl Scout Handbook*, p. 193.

**GIRL SCOUT BRONZE AWARD** - Earning one of the Signs is requirement #2 of the Girl Scout Bronze Award - *Junior Girl Scout Handbook*, p 203.

This could lead you into your Girl Scout Bronze Award Project. Requirement #4 - *Junior Girl Scout Handbook*, p 203.

## CADETTE and SENIOR GIRL SCOUTS

*Note: The hours that you spend during the Girls Care Initiative can only be used once, no double dipping. Decide which award you want to count them towards and attend the appropriate training required.*

**GIRL SCOUT SILVER or GOLD LEADERSHIP AWARDS** - If you attend training and lead your troop or service unit in planning a project (the key here is that you are the leader, facilitator and delegator), then you could count this as Leadership hours towards either the Girl Scout Silver Leadership Award or the Girl Scout Gold Leadership Award.

*Girl Scout Silver Award Go For It!* p. 13 Lead It- 2<sup>nd</sup> bullet Serve in a leadership role in Girl Scouts.

*Girl Scout Gold Award Go For It!* pgs. 12-13 Put Leadership Into Action-#5 bullet- Play a leadership role in your town or at a place of worship

**GIRL SCOUT COMMUNITY SERVICE BARS** - Take the 1 ½ hour training offered by the council and attend 2 ½ more hours of training from the *agency you choose to do service with*. Then give 25 hours of SERVICE to that *agency or organization*. If you are a Cadette Girl Scout you could earn your **Cadette Girl Scout Community Service Bar** and if you are a Senior Girl Scout, you could earn your **Senior Girl Scout Community Service Bar**.

OR

Attend the Juliette Leadership Seminar (4 hours of training) on November 17 from 10 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. at Timber Ridge Conference Center for a \$30 fee which includes lunch. Then give back 25 hours through Girls Care Initiative and at other Girl Scout service opportunities to earn your **Community Service Bar for Contributions to Girl Scouting**.

### GIRL SCOUT SILVER or GOLD 4Bs CHALLENGE

Use what you learn as a portion of your Silver or Gold 4B Challenge

*Girl Scout Silver Award Go For It!* p. 22 #3 4 Bs Challenge: Believe and #4 Build

*Girl Scout Gold Award Go For It!* Step #4 Bs Challenge: #2, 3, 4.

You can use the 4Bs Challenge if this leads to your Girl Scout Gold Award Project.

### LEADERSHIP HOUR QUALIFIERS:

- \*Facilitating a troop meeting to discuss location of project and overall scope of project
- \*Coordinating tasks by age and capability of volunteers
- \*Sending e-mail reminders and directions to potential volunteers
- \*Directing project activities the day-of
- \*Making a presentation to service unit (or troop) conveying the purpose and need to assist in your project
- \*Conducting a site visit to assess the needs of the recipient of the service
- \*Coordinating the pick-up and drop-off of your project materials
- \*Soliciting business for needed materials for your project

**\*\*Important Note:** Girls may only request 'In-Kind' donations. They can help prepare the donation letter, but an ADULT MUST ASK for the "In-Kind" donation. Girls cannot solicit at all. Volunteer letterhead is available for this purpose. The in-kind gifts are NOT tax deductible UNLESS you set up an account for them to be given in the name of the whole council through FUND DEVELOPMENT.
